HISTORICAL NOTE: Verses 1—4 of this hymn are verses 1, 2, 7 and 8 of the hymn of 9 verses composed to be sung by the children of Huntly on the occasion of the laying of the foundation stone of The Gordon Schools on 27th February, 1839, by Her Grace, Elizabeth Brodie, Duchess of Gordon who founded The Gordon Schools in memory of her husband, George, Fifth Duke of Gordon. The Founder's Day Hymn, as set to the music composed by Mr. Keith, was first sung at the Founder's Day Ceremony on Wednesday, 27th February, 1957, an annual Founder's Day Ceremony having been instituted on Monday, 27th February, 1956.
